Mr. John Truman Foshee, Sr., age 92 of Horton, Alabama passed away Wednesday, April 23, 2014 at Marshall Medical Center South.

Funeral services will be held at 11AM Saturday, April 26, 2014 from the Adams Brown Service Funeral Home Chapel with Bro. Morris Stephens officiating. Burial will follow in the Douglas Cemetery.

Mr. Foshee is survived by his daughter, Ann Foshee; grandchildren, Chad (Amanda) Cox, Alan (Holly) Cox, Scott Foshee, John Foshee, III, Aleasa Foshee, and Samantha (William) Amerson; sister, Sue Ross; brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Bill & Jane Carroll 3 nieces, 9 nephews, and 9 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 66 years, Mildred Carroll Foshee; son, John Foshee, Jr.; parents, Albert & Angie Foshee; and brother, Harold Foshee.

After attending Snead State for 2 years, Truman served our country during WWII by enlisting in the Navy as a Naval Aviator in 1942. Truman attained the rank of Lieutenant JG as a bomber pilot with Bombing Squadron 87 of the

carrier USS Ticonderoga in the Pacific Ocean. After WWII, Truman was discharged from the Navy and joined the Naval Air Reserve out of Birmingham. Truman worked for Ralston-Purina for 28 years before retiring and starting a motorcycle/lawnmower/small engine shop called Albertville Cycle which he owned and operated until 2012.
