Ronald was born on August 1, 1939, in Albertville, Alabama. He is a 1957 graduate of Albertville High School and a 1961 graduate of Jacksonville State University. At Jacksonville State, he met the love of his life Pat Keahey, and they married in 1961. Ronald earned and received a commission of a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army. He received his Juris Doctorate degree from Cumberland School of Law at Samford University, and upon graduation, returned to Albertville, where he practiced law. During his career, he also served as municipal judge for the City of Albertville and as Marshall County District Attorney. Ronald was a faithful member of the First Baptist Church of Albertville, where he served as a Sunday school teacher, deacon, and was recently elected a deacon emeritus. Ronald's joy was found in the Lord, his family, and his friends. He was preceded in death by his parents, Paul and Mary Evelyn Thompson, and his sister, Carole Thompson Roebuck.
